History

University was founded in 1960 as a general technical faculty of the Lviv Polytechnical Institute. In 1996 Ternopil Ivan Puluj State Technical University was established on the basis of Ternopil instrument-making institute. In 1997 the university was given the 4th level of accreditation and is the only one higher technical educational institution in Ternopil region. In 2009 the university was granted the status of a national one.

The mission of the University is to create the conditions for providing quality modern education through free creative training and research in accordance with social needs, caused by the development of Ukrainian science, economy and culture, as well as global processes of human civilization.


