Overall Experience

St. Petersburg is the second biggest city and also the cultural capital of Russia. Arrived here in sept'2017 and been here for four months now. City is damn beautiful, way beyond my expectations. Less English speakers though, but quite reasonable to stay in dormitory provided by the university.

All subjects were interesting and new, being from Mechanical background and at the same time very tough for us (mechies). University Campus is awesome and is at a walkable distance from the dormitory provided; which again is clean, neat and well maintained with good cultural and social relations between each other (International Students).
