# **Programme delivery:**

### Semester:

Fall semester starts at Ashoka in August and ends in December. Spring semester starts at the end of January and will last until May.

### Summer:

- > Duration: 6 weeks (July August)
- >> Each 4-credit course entails 40 contact hours.
